

We pray for teachers, students, and staff that this year might be rewarding for all.


Be with us as we face the challenge of new tasks, the fear of failure, the expectations of parents, friends, and self.



Lives Well Lived





The societal ills and issues that they struggled to overcome are still with us today. The question is whether we will join the effort or re-

main safely on the sidelines. Rep. Lewis often spoke of getting in good trouble. He referenced his friend, James Zwerg, referring to it as "necessary trouble." Dr. King talked of doing this work in an effort to "save the soul of America." May the following words become a mantra to help remind us of our obligation to faithfully live out our baptismal covenant.

August Outreach



The picture above is a sample of the non-perishable food items to fill three bags of groceries that families receive from the food pantry at Pulaski Heights Presbyterian Church.

For the month of August, we're teaming up with Pulaski Heights Presbyterian Church for our outreach ministry. They are a member of the Arkansas Food Bank and host a pantry that distributes weekly. The PHCC Board voted to make a donation of 499.99 to PHPC to supplement their efforts to purchase and provide more food this month. Jane Ann Sikes coordinates this outreach ministry. She provided a list of pantry and personal item needs. If you would like to make an additional donation, see the list on the following page.

* If you are wondering about the dollar amount, our church bylaws state that any check over five hundred dollars requires the signature of two Board members. We have a new slate of officers. We have not yet completed the paperwork to add two new signatories to our bank. The new Board will be addressing this need at the next meeting. However, we did not want to delay providing assistance to families in need at this very crucial time.

SUGGESTIONS FOR FOOD PANTRY

If and when you go to the grocery store, dollar store, warehouse food store, etc. our food pantry could always use a helping hand. We give out only non-perishable food items. Most of our canned food items are bought from the Arkansas Food Bank. Here are some suggestions for the needs of our food pantry:

- 1. macaroni & cheese-box or individual
- 2. dried milk-Kroger has a box of 10 individual packages
- 3. dry cereal
- 4. box of individual oatmeal packages
- 5. breakfast/cereal bars
- 6. individual packages of instant potatoes
- 7. spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles
- 8. saltine crackers
- 9. peanut butter crackers, cheese crackers
- 10. small jar of peanut butter
- 11. small jar jelly
- 12. Vienna sausages
- 13. beans- dried
- 14. cookies, individually wrapped
- 15. spaghetti noodles & spaghetti sauce
- 16. any canned vegetables

SUGGESTIONS FOR PERSONAL ITEMS

- 1. Small bars of soap
- 2. Small bottle of body wash
- 3. Combs and hair brushes
- 4. Wash rags
- 5. Face towels or bar towels
- 6. Small bottles of shampoo
- 7. Men & women razors
- 8. Shaving cream
- 9. Feminine hygiene products
- 10. Toilet paper-4 pack or less
- 11. Small tubes of hand/body lotion
