We learned on Monday, June 19th that the homeless have a need for bug spray. As we know, many bugs carry disease and bites can pose serious health problems. The homeless who live on the streets, in camps, or cars are exposed to these risks on a far more frequent basis than you and I.



Unfortunately, bug spray is not cheap. The cheapest I have found is Repel Insect to pg. 2

Repellent Sportsman Max Formula Spray Pump 7.5 fl oz that covers mosquitos, ticks, fleas, gnats for \$3.47 or Cutter Backwoods formula, 6 oz. for \$2.97. The Cutter spray is not as strong as the Repel product. Both are available through Wal-Mart.

To distribute these at our 3rd Monday night meal we need 120 cans. Can you help? Please get the word out through face book as well. Perhaps some of your friends can help. Our next 3rd Monday meal is July 17th.

On Sunday, June 25th, I had the pleasure of meeting Caroline Hamilton-Arnold who is on staff with Week of Compassion. Week of Compassion is our church's disaster relief and emergency response ministry. She was in town because she was meeting with our sister congregation, Park Hill, about the flooding that they had earlier in June. What was initially thought to be a minor problem has turned out to be a much larger problem with a great deal of flooring and dry wall having to be ripped out.

It was wonderful to see Week of Compassion at work right here in our own back yard. Caroline shared about week of compassion work sites across our Great River Region including updates from the flooding in Louisiana that occurred last year.

I learned that when week of compassion sets up a mission team, they are often involved for a long time. They don't just come in, disburse funds, and leave. They work to coordinate efforts among all kinds of local agencies and ministries. They bring volunteers and recruit volunteers and they work until problems are resolved.
