## Happy Birthday to the Church Universal

What better way to celebrate the birthday of the Church than to birth new churches? When you contribute to the Pentecost special offering that is exactly what you are doing—helping to birth new churches. That is important because new churches are the best way to reach new people for Christ. People find it is much easier to join a new church than it is to try to break into an established church.

The story of Pentecost is found in chapter 2 of the book of Acts. Acts is volume 2 of Luke's story of Jesus' life. It is the follow up story of the early church. It begins with Jesus' ascension into heaven, a report on picking a disciple to take Judas' place, and the communal life of the early disciples.

Then comes the celebration of Pentecost in Jerusalem, and God chooses that moment for the arrival of the Holy Spirit. The Spirit gets busy right away shaking things up and adding people to the number of Jesus' followers.

People are astonished to see the Spirit alighting on Jesus' followers like tongues of fire, and the Spirit loosens the tongues of the Disciples to be able to share the good news in the languages of each and every visitor to Jerusalem.

The people assume that perhaps the disciples have had a little too much to drink. Peter dismisses that idea, noting that it is only 9 in the morning. He assures them that what they are seeing and hearing was predicted by

the prophet, Joel. "I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams; yea, and on my menservants and my maidservants in those days I will pour out my spirit; and they shall prophesy."

The Spirit of God knows no restrictions based on human distinctions of age, sex, station in life, language, culture, or ethnicity. God pours out the Spirit upon all flesh.

Peter then goes on to tell the people about Jesus—who he was, what he did, and how he was betrayed and crucified. This story cuts to the heart of Jesus' people and many repent and believe.

The story of Pentecost is so familiar that we may easily miss some of the profound implications it has for the church. On the day of its birth the Church was multi-lingual, multi-cultural, and ethnically diverse. Just ask anyone who has ever had to read the story in church. The names of all the different countries can be tough to pronounce.

Please give generously to the Pentecost offering so that we may spread the good news of Jesus to new Christians. On the church's Birthday, and every day may we always remember to celebrate its beautiful, colorful diversity. The Spirit makes us one.



Each time I help cook for the homeless, I notice that there are some things that are in short supply.

They are simple and inexpensive things but also very useful things:

- Towels and dish cloths
- Measuring cup set
- Glass Pyrex measuring cup, 16 oz. and 32 oz.
- Potato Peeler
- Sponges with scrub pad on one side
- A chopper
- A Mandoline (hand held slicer)
- Cookie Sheet

If you can provide any of these things (used are fine if in good shape) then please let the church office know and bring them to church on Pentecost or when you can.
