Regional Assembly 2018

Where do I begin? The first weekend of November, I attended Regional Assembly. We were hosted by Kings Highway Christian Church in Shreveport, LA. The pastor is Rev. David Brice. He is also the brother-in-law of Elder Miles Cook. We were treated to southern hospitality at its finest. The congregation made us welcome and fed us well.



This year's theme was "Message Bearers" with the focus on reconciliation as found in 2 Corinthians 5:17-21. I attended the Pre-Assembly event for clergy, elders and congregational lay leaders for a pro-reconciliation and anti-racism training led by Rev. Sandra Jha from the Oakland Peace Center and John Goebel. Vice President. Treasury Services. With warmth, humor, vulnerability and grace, they led us through challenging topics and difficult discussions that we, as church, tend to avoid. We have a story and in sharing our stories, we invite others into fellowship. There were a number of workshops. I attended "Experiencing the Gospel Through a

Global Lens (Africa)," led by Dr. Burton. She presented slides from her trip to Africa visiting: Ghana, Durban, Cape Town and other stops along the way to share, learn and fellowship with our global ministries partners.

Friday evening, we gathered for worship. It was a phenomenal and spirit filled night. As Great River Region, we came from all corners of Arkansas, Louisiana and Mississippi. There was great diversity in age, ethnicity and life experiences among us. Yet we were One.

The All Assembly Choir, under the direction of Dr. Jeffrey A. Murdock, set the tone through their ministry of song that opened hearts and cleared minds in preparation for the Word.

The first speaker was DeeOnn Hodges, who shared her faith story of living and dealing with a serious health issue.

It was awe inspiring and thought provoking. She poised a very poignant question and one that we can all reflect on in our spiritual lives. "Do I trust the God I believe in?"

The sermon was delivered by our General Minister and President, Rev. Terri Hord Owens, who lifted the theme of "Message Bearers" reminding us that like Paul, we bear Christ in our bodies. We need to be bold in our proclamation. She challenged us with a quote from another Disciples minister, Rev. Otis Moss III. "We preach Jesus, but we need to preach what Jesus preached." I had the privilege of serving as "armor bearer" to Rev. Hord Owens. She was warm, humorous and gracious. During her sermon, I learned something

about her that threatened to disrupt the peace and harmony between us. She attended *Harvard*. I'm a **Yalie!** In keeping with the spirit of the Assembly, we reconciled.

On Saturday, Dr. Burton delivered the State of the Region Report. We were presented with reports on ministries and work that is taking place throughout the Region. A number of resolutions were passed. A copy of the booklet containing the resolutions is available in Hunter Hall if you are interested in reading any of the reports. The outgoing Board members were honored for their service and the new Board members were installed. That evening, we were treated to a wonderful banquet.

Slow Cooker Beef Pot Roast



Recipe by: Chef John

Ingredients

- 1 (5 pound) bone-in beef pot roast salt and pepper to taste
- 1 tablespoon all-purpose flour, or as needed
- 2 tablespoons vegetable oil

- 8 ounces sliced mushrooms
- 1 medium onion, chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 tablespoon butter
- 1 1/2 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 1 tablespoon tomato paste
- 2 1/2 cups chicken broth
- 3 medium carrots, cut into chunks
- 2 stalks celery, cut into chunks
- 1 sprig fresh rosemary
- 2 sprigs fresh thyme

Directions

Prep 20 m, Cook 6 h 30 m, Ready In 6 h 50 m

- 1. Generously season both sides of roast with salt and pepper. Sprinkle flour over the top until well coated, and pat it into the meat. Shake off any excess.
- 2. Heat vegetable oil in a large skillet over medium-high heat until hot. Sear the roast on both sides for 5-6 minutes each, until well browned. Remove from the skillet and set aside.
- 3. Reduce the heat to medium and stir in mushrooms and butter; cook for 3-4 minutes.
- 4. Stir in onion; cook for 5 minutes, until onions are translucent and begin to brown. Add garlic, stir for about a minute.
- 5. Stir in 1 1/2 tablespoons flour; cook and stir for about 1 minute. Add tomato paste and cook for another minute.
- 6. Slowly add chicken stock, stir to combine, and return to a simmer. Remove skillet from the heat.
- 7. Place carrots and celery in the slow cooker.
 Place roast over the vegetables and pour in any accumulated juices. Add rosemary and thyme.
- 8. Pour onion and mushroom mixture over the top of the roast. Cover slow cooker, turn to high and cook the roast for 5-6 hours, until the meat is fork tender.
- 9. Skim off any fat from the surface and remove the bones. Season with salt and pepper to taste.
