


The choir functioned for many years singing at various events to support the Oasis Center and to provide entertainment for some of the dinners. We also had a rehearsal every other Tuesday with a meal to follow. We put together special programs for the 4th of July, Thanksgiving an Christmas, which were some of my favorite events. We always closed the evenings at the dinners and events with the song Holy Ground" which included the entire group singing along with the choir.
